

Integrated Language Arts (7-12) Teacher Licensure Requirements

Program Requirements

- Gen Ed: Satisfactory completion of all general education requirements (generally 55 sem hrs).
- Major: Satisfactory completion of a major in English approved for purposes of teacher licensure (37 sem hrs) plus related coursework for a total of 53-57 sem hrs.
- Education: Satisfactory completion of a minor in education (34 sem hrs) as described below.
- Note: Beginning with the class of 2010, all courses in the teaching field must be passed with grades of C- or higher. See the Academic Catalog for additional requirements for admission and continuance in the program. Courses may not be offered every year. Be sure to check with the department for schedule of course offerings.*
