**ALL-NCAC FIELD HOCKEY SQUAD ANNOUNCED;
UFER, HAPP, GRAHAM COLLECT TOP HONORS**

CLEVELAND -- Wittenberg senior midfielder **Blair Ufer (Ann Arbor, MI/Ann Arbor Pioneer)** and senior back **Carrie Happ (Pittsburgh, PA/Vincentian)** have been named Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year to highlight the 2004 All-North Coast Athletic Conference field hockey selections.

Ufer led all NCAC scorers this fall with 18 goals and 13 assists for 49 points over 20 games (2.45 ppg). The senior finishes her four-year career with 26 goals and 29 assists for 81 points over 79 games (1.03 ppg). She has three consecutive appearances on the All-NCAC first team.

Happ recorded seven defensive saves and was the anchor of a defensive unit which shut out a league-high seven opponents. The Tigers had the second best team goals-against average this season (1.24) after allowing only 25 goals in 20 games. Wooster allowed the fewest goals in NCAC play (13) and the second fewest overall of any of the league's seven teams. She also contributed on the other end of the field with 10 assists. Happ moves to the All-NCAC first team after earning a second-team nod last fall.

Joining Ufer as repeat first-team selections are: Denison forwards **Karen Lancaster (Hurst, TX/L.D. Bell)**, a senior, and **Jenny Lacey (Phoenix, MD/Notre Dame Prep)**, a junior and Oberlin senior midfielder **Jaime Johnson (Cleveland, Hts., OH/Laurel School)**.

Kenyon's **Carolyn Graham (Chadds Ford, PA/Westminster)** is the 2004 Newcomer of the Year as one of only three freshman named to the second team. She scored three goals and two assists to average 0.42 points per game and helped lead the Ladies to the championship game of the NCAC Tournament for the first time.

Kenyon's **Robin Cash** was voted Coach of the Year for the first time. Cash led the Ladies to a second place finish in the regular season and to a runner-up finish in the North Coast Tournament. She is 27-25 in her three seasons at Kenyon. Cash also serves as Kenyon's head women's lacrosse coach, a position she has held since 1998.
