**ALL-NCAC FIELD HOCKEY SQUAD ANNOUNCED;
LACEY, MUDRY COLLECT TOP HONORS**

CLEVELAND -- Denison senior forward **Jenny Lacey (Phoenix, MD/Notre Dame Prep)** and Oberlin senior back **Rosemary Mudry (University Hts., OH/Laurel School)** have been named Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year to highlight the 2005 All-North Coast Athletic Conference field hockey selections.

Lacey led all Big Red scorers this fall with 10 goals and 4 assists for 24 points over 19 games (1.26 ppg). She was fourth in the NCAC in total points and points per game and was tied for fifth in total goals and goals per game. The senior finishes her four-year career with 44 goals and 9 assists for 97 points over 73 games (1.33 ppg). She led Denison in scoring in each of the past four years and has four consecutive appearances on the All-NCAC first team. She was named Newcomer of the Year in 2002.

Mudry recorded one defensive save and was the anchor of a defensive unit which shut out a seven opponents and which led the North Coast with a meager 1.10 goals allowed per game this fall. The Yeowomen had the second best team goals-against average this season (1.18) after allowing only 23 goals in 21 games. Oberlin allowed the fewest goals in NCAC play (10). Mudry also contributed on the other end of the field with four goals and three assists and was a big part in helping the Yeowomen win their second NCAC Championship and first NCAC Tournament title. She moves to the All-NCAC first team after earning second-team nods the last two years and an honorable mention award as a freshman.

Joining Lacey as repeat first-team selections are a pair of seniors: Oberlin midfielder **Meg Reitz (Worcester, MA/Doherty)** and Wittenberg forward **Julia Wickham (Columbus, OH/Granview)**. Three players make their first first-team appearances after stints on the second team: Wooster senior forward **Lindsey Tingley (Rockville, MD/Walter Johnson)**, Kenyon senior back **Kate Flinner (Fairfield, PA/Fairfield)** and Denison sophomore **Read Powel (Shaker Hts., OH/Hathaway Brown)**. Tingley was named to the second team in each of the past three seasons, while Flinner earned second team honors in 2003 and '04. Powel was named to the second team as a freshman last fall. Wooster junior forward **Anlyn Addis (Ann Arbor, MI/Ann Arbor Pioneer)** and Ohio Wesleyan sophomore goalkeeper **Katie Jones (Pine Plains, NY/Stissing Mountain)** both jump to the first team after earning honorable mention awards last fall.

Oberlin's **Abigail Brox (Manchester, MA/St. George's School)** is the 2005 Newcomer of the Year as one of only two freshmen named to the first team. She led the conference in total goals (14) and goals per game (0.70) and was second in points (32) and points per game (1.60).

Oberlin's **Deb Ranieri** was voted Coach of the Year for the first time after leading the Yeowomen to their second North Coast championship and their first North Coast Tournament title. She led Oberlin to its first win in the NCAA Division III Field Hockey Tournament, a 1-0 win over Lebanon Valley in the opening round. She is 40-67 in her four seasons at Oberlin. Ranieri also serves as Oberlin's head women's lacrosse coach.
