

# 2006 Wittenberg University Football

## Pre-Game News & Notes - Nov. 18, 2006 at Capital

• **SETTING THE SCENE:** For the first time since 2002, the Wittenberg Tigers have postseason life. Overcoming a slow start, the Tigers won seven of their last eight games to claim a share of the North Coast Athletic Conference title and the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Division III Tournament.

Wittenberg has a tall task ahead, however, as the NCAA Division III Football Tournament Committee chose to pair the Tigers opposite Central Ohio rival Capital in the first round. The two teams have opened each of the last three seasons against one another, and the Crusaders have won handily each time, including a 57-7 victory on Sept. 2, 2006. The two teams will square off again at Capital's Bernlohr Stadium.

The Tigers, who are making their 12th appearance in the NCAA Division III Tournament and sixth in 11 years under Head Coach Joe Fincham, bring a 7-3 overall record into the postseason. Capital is 9-1 overall after finishing second in the Ohio Athletic Conference with an 8-1 record. The fifth-ranked Crusaders' lone loss was at No. 1 Mount Union.

• **GOOD SEATS STILL AVAILABLE:** Tickets for the NCAA Division III Tournament game are \$8 for adults and \$4 for students. No passes of any kind will be accepted. Advance ticket sales have taken place at both Capital and Wittenberg this week, but general admission tickets will also be available at Bernlohr Stadium starting at 10:30 a.m. Saturday. • **A COACHING MILESTONE:** Joe Fincham won his 99th game as Wittenberg's head coach against Hiram on Nov. 4, moving him past the legendary Bill Edwards for second place in school history for coaching victories. The National College Football Hall of Famer, who led the Tigers from 1955-69, compiled a record of 98-20-4, good for a winning percentage of .820.

A week later, Fincham added win No. 100 as the Tigers topped Hiram College on Nov. 11. He became the second Wittenberg football coach to reach the 100-win plateau, and he now trails another small college coaching legend on Wittenberg's career coaching victory list, Dave Maurer. Also a member of the National College Football Hall of Fame, Maurer compiled a 129-23-3 record between 1969-83, good for a school-record .842 winning percentage. Fincham's career record is now 100-22 in his 11-year Wittenberg career, good for a winning percentage of .819.

• **DEJA VU?:** In 1988, Wittenberg lost to the University of Dayton 38-0 in the season opener. Much like the 2006 season, which opened with a 57-7 loss at Capital, Wittenberg came back to earn a first-round NCAA Division III Tournament re-match.

In a surprising result, the Tigers topped Dayton in that game 35-28 in double overtime. The 2006 Tigers certainly hope to match that.

• **SCOUTING THE TIGER OFFENSE:** The focal point of the Wittenberg offense is senior tailback Tristan Murray, who has accounted for more than 50 percent of the Tigers' total yards from scrimmage. Murray led the NCAC in rushing yards and scoring for a second straight year, finishing the season with a school record nine straight 100-yard performances. Murray's 142.6 rushing yards per game and 11.4 points per game were tops in the NCAC, while his 170.9 all-purpose yards per contest ranks second. All three were career-highs for Murray.

Wittenberg continues to develop other offensive weapons as well, including freshman quarterback Aaron Huffman, who had perhaps his finest game as a collegian against Allegheny on Nov. 4. Huffman, who has three rushing touchdowns, including a 69-yard burst against Dayton, and 10 touchdown passes on the season, rushed for 84 yards and threw for another 116 in an efficient performance against the Gators. Sophomore wide receiver Patrick Williams is his favorite target with 26 receptions for 258 yards, including eight catches for 94 yards in a key win over Wabash on Oct. 14.

A year after setting a school record for catches by a running back with 29 in 2005, Murray has 24 receptions for 283 yards in 2006, including four catches for 50 yards and a touchdown in a key win over Wooster on Sept. 30. In addition, junior fullback Andy Vanover, who had matching 154-yard totals receiving and rushing in 2005, has been even more effective this year with 176 yards and a touchdown on 38 carries and a team-high 290 yards on 15 receptions, including a career-high three-touchdown effort against Earlham. Vanover has gained yards on each of his 53 touches this season.

• **UP THE CHARTS:** He won't quite re-write the Wittenberg record books, but Tristan Murray's name figures to be included in media guides for a long time to come. He has topped 100 yards nine straight weeks to break the school record of six set by Aaron Powers in 1996 and break the record of eight 100-yard games in a season he tied last year. In addition, Murray now has 24 career 100-yard rushing games, which ties the school record.

Murray's 142.6 rushing yards accounted for more than 75 percent of the team's rushing total in 2006. His 142.6 yards per game ranks 5th in NCAA Division III this year, while ranks sixth in the scoring and all-purpose yards. The only team he did not rush for 100 yards against was Capital.

## TUNE IN TO THE TIGERS!

All Wittenberg athletic broadcasts can be heard locally on WUSO 89.1-FM, the university's student-operated station. They also can be heard around the world on the Internet thanks to Wittenberg's partnership with Stretch Internet. Wittenberg fans do not have to pay to listen to broadcasts, and anyone with a computer and an Internet connection can log in and listen.

Wittenberg is blessed with outstanding radio coverage again in 2006 as Scott Leo, who spends his summers as the play-by-play voice of the Columbus Clippers, heads things up. Leo, who has been involved with Wittenberg athletic broadcasts since 2000, has been joined in the booth this season by several different Wittenberg student broadcasters. This week, the student broadcast team takes over as senior Josh Cohick, WUSO sports director in 2006-07, calls the play-by-play and junior Sarah Fetters makes her debut as color analyst. Wittenberg student broadcasters are involved in all aspects of the broadcasts, including sideline reporting, statistical analysis, on-air work, in-game score updates and production work with in WUSO's studio.

Murray stands second in school history in career rushing yards and scoring. Casey Donaldson holds the records in both categories with 5,112 rushing yards and 408 total points. Because NCAA Division III Tournament statistics now count toward career, season and game records, Murray has a chance to improve upon his totals. Interestingly, Donaldson compiled exactly 1,000 rushing yards in NCAA Division III action that do not count toward his career numbers.

• **SCOUTING THE TIGER DEFENSE:** Hard-hitting defense is a Wittenberg hallmark, and a 2006 unit re-built on the fly early in the season is clearly hitting its stride. After allowing 509 yards per game in three nonconference contests, Wittenberg turned it around at just the right time and has held its seven NCAC opponents to an average of 243 yards per contest, a figure that would rank second in the NCAC in total defense.

Only Allegheny, which boasts an offense ranked in the top 10 nationally, surpassed the 300-yard mark against Wittenberg in the last seven weeks. The Tigers allowed just 45 yards in the season finale against Hiram. Also of note, just one running back has topped 100 yards against the Tigers all season.

Senior linebacker Tyler Harmon leads Wittenberg with 101 tackles, which ranks first in the NCAC and 42nd nationally. Harmon, a converted fullback and three-time honorable mention All-NCAC honoree, led the Tigers in tackles eight straight games.

• **KEY STAT - TURNOVERS:** A key to the Tigers' defensive play has been turnovers - Wittenberg has generated 21 in 10 games this year, but just three have come in its three losses. In its seven wins, Wittenberg has a turnover differential of 18-11 as the Tigers have generated at least two opponent miscues in each game.

Senior safety Adam Hewitt has recovered two fumbles, including one he returned for a touchdown against Alma, senior safety Will Block has forced two fumbles, both inside the Tigers' 10-yard-line, senior linebacker Joe Swanson has two interceptions and a key fumble recovery against Oberlin and freshman cornerback Brandyn Brown has two fumble recoveries and two highlight-reel interceptions. Swanson ranks second on the team in total tackles and first in tackles for loss with 11.5.

• **NCAC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:** Four times in 2006 a Wittenberg player earned special NCAC recognition.

On Oct. 15, Tristan Murray rushed for 156 yards on 35 carries and caught another three passes for 33 yards in the win over Wabash to earn NCAC Offensive Player of the Week honors.

On Oct. 2, Joe Swanson was recognized as NCAC Defensive Player of the Week. He had a key second-quarter interception that set up a touchdown, seven tackles, including two for loss, and a sack for a nine-yard loss in a 24-21 win over Wooster on Sept. 30.

On Sept. 24, Adam Hewitt's award-winning performance against Alma included 12 total tackles, two sacks, two forced fumbles, a fumble recovery for a touchdown that tied the game in the second quarter and a 69-yard kickoff return that set up another score.

On Nov. 15, Tristan Murray rushed for 175 yards on 14 carries and caught another three passes for 30 yards in the win over Hiram to earn NCAC Offensive Player of the Week honors for a second time in 2006.

• **SCOUTING THE CRUSADERS:** Capital is the highest ranked one-loss team in the nation at No. 4 in the d3football.com poll, No. 5 in the American Football Coaches Association poll and No. 7 in the Football Gazette poll. The

Crusaders have reached that lofty position by putting together a very complete team that is outscoring its opponents 36.7-11.4. Leading the charge is senior quarter Rocky Pentello, who holds all of Capital's passing records.

• **SERIES HISTORY:** Wittenberg leads the all-time series 28-5, although Capital is on a three-game winning streak. The two teams will also open the 2007 season with a game in Springfield.

• **LAST TIME OUT:** The Wittenberg Tigers celebrated the program's eighth NCAC title in 17 years in the league and Head Coach Joe Fincham's 100th career win in the muck and mire of Hiram College's Henry Field following Saturday's 35-0 victory.

The Tigers' winning combination was a powerful rushing attack that struck for five first-half touchdowns and a stifling defense that allowed just 45 yards on 46 plays in the entire game. Joe Swanson led the charge defensively with eight tackles, including two for a combined loss of 17 yards.

Offensively, Tristan Murray ran for 175 yards and four touchdowns on just 14 carries before exiting the game before halftime. Murray was also Wittenberg's leading receiver on the day with three catches for 30 yards.

• **THE COACHES:** Wittenberg is led by Joe Fincham, a 1988 graduate of Ohio University. In his 11th season at the helm, Fincham has a 100-22 overall record, including a mark of 68-10 in the NCAC, a regular season record of 93-17 and an NCAA Division III Tournament mark of 7-5. His teams have claimed six conference titles, including four straight outright with undefeated records from 1998-2001. Fincham has been named NCAC Coach of the Year four times.

Capital is led by Jim Collins, Wittenberg class of 1988, who has a record of 56-47 (.544) in 10 seasons as head coach. Since back-to-back 1-9 seasons before Collins took over in 1997, Capital has become one of the nation's top programs with six straight winning seasons and a pair of NCAA playoff appearances. Collins was named the American Football Coaches Association North Region Coach of the Year last season and has earned OAC Coach of the Year twice.
