

# 2008 Wittenberg University Football

## Pre-Game News & Notes - Oct. 4, 2008 vs. Hiram

• **SETTING THE SCENE:** The Tigers come off an strong showing in their first contest of the year without starting quarterback **Aaron Huffman**. Senior signal caller **Matt Brumfield** guided the Tigers to a 2-1 record following a 32-0 shutout victory over rival Ohio Wesleyan last week.

Hiram comes off of their first loss of the season, a 41-6 contest against UAA foe Carnegie-Mellon, and now sit at 2-1. The Terriers come home for the first time this season after playing their first three contests away from Charles A. Henry Field.

• **SERIES HISTORY:** The Tigers and Terriers meet for just the 10th time in the series, with Wittenberg holding a 9-0-0 record over Hiram. In those previous meetings, the Tigers have outscored the Terriers 555-41.

The historic series is not lengthy on account of the fact that the Terriers have only been a part of the North Coast Athletic Conference since December 1998. In their most recent meeting in 2007, the Tigers topped the Terriers in Springfield by a 70-20 score.

• **SCOUTING THE TIGER OFFENSE:** The Wittenberg offense has a different look now that Huffman, the 2006 NCAC Newcomer of the Year who became just the fourth Tiger signal-caller to top 2,000 passing yards in a season in 2007, is sidelined for the season. After piling up more than 3,600 passing yards and 400 rushing yards in 23 straight starts, Huffman turned the ball over to senior quarterback **Matt Brumfield** midway through the loss to Washington University.

Brumfield, who started two games as a freshman in 2005 (also due to injury, after Ryan Holmes broke his collarbone against Capital), played well in relief, completing 11-of-18 passes for 134 yards and a touchdown against the Bears. In his first start of 2008, Brumfield managed the game well with a 9-of-16 performance for 68 yards and a pair of scores against OWU.

There isn't a position on the field left untouched by the injury bug, including running back. Fortunately, the Tigers have depth at that spot, as sophomore **Rod Belcher** and freshman **Trevor Luckenbill** split carries against Washington University, combining for more than 130 yards. Luckenbill went on to have a breakout game last week against Ohio Wesleyan, where he totaled 117 yards on 19 carries. The shutout over the Bishops also signified the resurgence of **Tony Hall**, who scored three touchdowns in his short-yardage opportunities after missing the entire 2007 season due to injury.

At wide receiver, freshman **Josh McKee** has emerged as a perfect complement to senior **Patrick Williams**, who accumulated 910 yards and six touchdowns in 2007 and already has 14 catches for 289 yards in 2008. McKee already has 15 receptions for a whopping 267 yards and six touchdowns through his first three collegiate games.

• **DOUBLE DUTY:** Patrick Williams has been setting records on the gridiron and on the baseball field in his Wittenberg career.

Williams returned to the football starting lineup in 2008 after setting school records for receptions in a season (56) and a game (12 vs. Wabash) in 2007. He was the team leader in receptions and receiving yards by a wide margin a year ago after finishing second in both categories in 2006.

With 14 receptions through three games in 2008, Williams has moved into seventh place on the Wittenberg career receiving list with 97. At his current pace, Williams could move as high as third place on the list, currently occupied by Rod Miller (1964-67) with 143 career catches, by the end of this, his third season in the football Red & White.

In addition, Williams has started all but two of the Tigers' baseball games over the last three years. In 114 total games, including 112 starting assignments, the speedy outfielder ranked among the team leaders in numerous offensive categories in 2006, 2007 and 2008.

Williams, who set a school record with a 27-game hitting streak stretching across the last 14 games of 2007 and the first 13 of 2008, has a career batting average of .342. A second-team All-NCAC honoree in 2006 and 2008 to go along with his first-team All-NCAC award in football in 2007, Williams has 31 doubles, six triples, six home runs, 85 RBI and 33 stolen bases in his baseball career.

• **MANPOWER:** No fewer than eight offensive lineman have been pressed into service already in 2008, and not because the Tigers have been involved in blowouts that allowed the second string to get some much-needed game reps.

Injuries have forced the Wittenberg coaching staff to shuffle the offensive line deck multiple times of late, with the tentative starting assignments against Hiram going to junior **Ryan Metzger** and sophomore **Nick Hudepohl** at the tackle spots, senior Brady Swift and junior **Jeremy Block** at the guard spots and junior **Dillon Hollin** at center. Junior **Tony Eich** and sophomore **Alex Burwell** started at the tackle positions in the opener before being sidelined by injury, while junior **Clay Hewson** has seen playing time off the bench as well.

• **SCOUTING THE TIGER DEFENSE:** After ranking first in the NCAC in scoring and team defense in 2007, the Tigers return nine starters, including three all-conference honorees.

Talent and experience is spread around on the Tiger defense, but nowhere is the depth better than along the line. No fewer than nine players are in the playing mix, led by senior defensive tackle **Lance**

## TUNE IN TO THE TIGERS!

All Wittenberg athletic broadcasts can be heard locally on WUSO 89.1-FM, the university's student-operated station. They also can be heard around the world on the Internet thanks to Wittenberg's partnership with Stretch Internet. Wittenberg fans do not have to pay to listen to broadcasts, and anyone with a computer and an Internet connection can log in and listen.

Wittenberg is blessed with outstanding radio coverage again in 2008 as Scott Leo, who spends his summers as the play-by-play voice of the Columbus Clippers, heads things up. Leo, who has been involved with Wittenberg athletic broadcasts since 2000, will be joined by Assistant Sports Information Director Ben Bradley and Wittenberg sophomore Zach Spring on the majority of this fall's football broadcasts.

The student broadcast team is bigger and better than ever in 2008-09, led by WUSO Sports Director Rob Lehner. The Wittenberg student broadcasters are involved in all aspects of the broadcasts, including sideline reporting, statistical analysis, on-air color analysis, in-game score updates and production work. This year, the team has ambitious plans to produce more than 100 athletics broadcasts in as many as 11 sports, including football, volleyball, men's soccer, women's soccer, field hockey, men's basketball, women's basketball, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, baseball and softball.

• **COACHES SHOW:** Tiger Talk is back again in 2008. It can be heard locally on WUSO 89.1-FM and on the Internet from 7-8 p.m. every Thursday. Leo hosts the show, which features interviews with players and coaches and analysis of the Tigers' season to date.

**Phillips**, a 2007 first-team All-NCAC honoree.

Sophomore linebacker **Brad McKinley** led all freshman in NCAA Division III with 120 tackles a year ago en route to NCAC Newcomer of the Year honors a year ago. Despite injury problems, McKinley has come up with a total of 26 tackles through three games. He has been joined in the starting lineup by junior **Kyle Lohrman**, the team leader with 28 tackles so far in 2008, and the tandem of sophomore **Ben Maxwell** and freshman **Zach Hurtt**, who had a breakout performance against Ohio Wesleyan with 12 tackles, a forced fumble and his first career interception.

Rounding things out, the Tiger secondary is very experienced, starting on the corners with junior **Brandyn Brown**, a 2007 all-conference selection, and senior **Travis Brunic**. Sophomore safety **Manny Rodriguez** stands third on the team in tackles so far this year after ranking among the team leaders in 2007 as well.

• **BIG PLAY EDDIE:** Sophomore defensive end **Eddie Vallery** has made the most of his first three collegiate starting assignments, leading the team with 10 tackles, a sack and a blocked kick against Washington University after registering four tackles, a sack, and two forced fumbles in the opener against Olivet. Vallery picked up right where he left off against OWU, tallying eight tackles, including 1.5 for loss.

• **SCOUTING THE TERRIERS:** Hiram enters the contest off to its best start since 2001, sitting at 2-1 with a conference win already under their belt. The Terriers will turn to all-conference quarterback **Trevor Henderson** to lead the charge, with Henderson already accumulating 700 yards passing and 100 yards rushing in his first three games in 2008.

Defensively, linebacker **Jon Hull** leads the team in tackles with 37, while the Terrier pass defense ranks second in the league, only allowing 127.0 yards per contest.

• **THE COACHES:** Wittenberg is led by Joe Fincham, a 1988 graduate of Ohio University. In his 12th season at the helm, Fincham has a 110-26 overall record, including a mark of 75-11 in the NCAC and a regular season record of 102-19. His teams have claimed six conference titles, including four straight outright with undefeated records from 1998-2001. Fincham has been named NCAC Coach of the Year five times, including 2006 after he led the Tigers to a conference title, and earned American Football Coaches Association/Kodak District IV Coach of the Year honors in 1998.

Fincham stands second in school history with 105 wins, trailing only National College Football Hall of Famer Dave Maurer, who posted a 129-23-3 record between 1969-83. Fincham is third in winning percentage as his .806 mark trails Maurer (.842) and fellow National College Football Hall of Famer Bill Edwards, who had a 98-20-4 record between 1955-69.

Hiram is coached by Bob Wolfe, in his second year at the helm of the Terrier program. With more than 35 years of coaching under his belt, Wolfe guided the Terriers to an 0-10 season in his first year, but he and his staff have Hiram off to a 2-1 start in 2008. Wolfe has been head coach at Tiffin University (1990-97), Allegheny College (1984-85), as well as at numerous high schools. He has also been an assistant coach at Bowling Green State University and Austin Peay State University.

• **DAVE MAURER DAY:** In recognition of his impact on thousands of lives in nearly 40 years as a coach, administrator and professor at Wittenberg, the Wittenberg Committee to Honor Dave Maurer has formed to celebrate Dave

Maurer Day on Saturday, Nov. 1. The event coincides with Wittenberg's final regular season home game against NCAC rival Denison, which kicks off at 1 p.m. that day at Edwards-Maurer Field.

Maurer will be informally honored at halftime of the football game. A reunion dinner for Maurer, his family, friends, former players, fans and supporters will follow in Pam Evans Smith Arena in the HPER Center, starting with a social hour at 5 p.m.

Maurer, a 1987 Wittenberg Athletics Hall of Honor inductee, coached track and field, swimming and diving, and golf at various points during his Wittenberg career, in addition to his well-known exploits on the football sidelines. He also served as the university's director of men's athletics and was a professor of health and physical education.

After more than a decade as an assistant football coach at Wittenberg, Maurer took the reins in 1969. He posted a career record of 129-23-3, good for an .842 winning percentage, and directed three teams to national championships. The Tigers went undefeated three times and won seven Ohio Athletic Conference championships in his 15 seasons as head coach.
