Pre-Game News & Notes - Sept. 6, 2008 vs. Olivet

• **SETTING THE SCENE:** There is a spring in the step of the Wittenberg Tigers, who welcome 16 returning starters to the Edwards-Maurer Field sidelines in hopes of moving back to the top of the North Coast Athletic Conference (NCAC) and beyond in 2008. Picked to win the NCAC for the ninth time in 19 years as a member and ranked nationally in two preseason polls, Wittenberg kicks off this campaign of lofty expectations – even for the winningest small college football program in NCAA Division III history – against 2007 Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association champion Olivet.

The Tigers, who finished second in the NCAC for the fourth time in the last six years in 2007, face an Olivet team that returns 10 starters and has been picked to finish third in the MIAA.

• **SERIES HISTORY:** After last year's narrow 17-16 victory on Olivet's home field, the Wittenberg Tigers hold a 4-0 lead in the all-time series between the two Great Lakes Region schools.

Interestingly, the four previous games in the series were all played in different decades. Wittenberg won by shutout in 1924, 1955 and 1987, before the aforementioned one-point win in 2007.

• **SCOUTING THE TIGER OFFENSE:** The Wittenberg offense revolves around junior quarterback **Aaron Huffman**, the 2006 NCAC Newcomer of the Year who became just the fourth Tiger signal-caller to top 2,000 passing yards in a season in 2007. With 21 starts already under his belt, Huffman has run for more than 400 career yards and passed for more than 3,300.

He is surrounded by playmakers on an offense that does not feature a single starter who will have exhausted his collegiate eligibility at the end of the 2008 season (wide receiver **Patrick Williams** is listed as a senior, but 2008 will be his third year of collegiate football). As tradition would have it, the skill position to focus on first is tailback, where sophomores **Corey Weber** and **Rod Belcher** are likely to split duties in 2008 after combining for more than 800 yards from scrimmage a year ago.

Williams returns after setting school records for receptions in a season (56) and a game (12 vs. Wabash) in 2007. In more than doubling his catch total from 2006, Williams emerged as the most reliable offensive player in the Tiger offense in 2007, accumulating 910 and six touchdowns in.

Sophomore **Anthony Kralich** is back in the fold after catching 20 passes as a complement to Williams a year ago. The other two wideouts in the two-deep – sophomore **Bill French** and freshman **Josh McKee** – have never caught a collegiate pass, but they will be called upon to step up in the absence of first-team All-NCAC junior tight end **Mat Guida**, who is sidelined to start the season due to injury.

The offensive line is anchored by junior All-NCAC center **Dillon Hollin**. He is one of three returning starters on a line that will start two sophomores and three juniors against Olivet.

• **DOUBLE DUTY:** Patrick Williams has been setting records on the gridiron and on the baseball field in his Wittenberg career.

The team leader in receptions and receiving yards by a wide margin a year ago after finishing second in both categories in 2006, Williams has started all but two of the Tigers' baseball games over the last three years. In 114 total games, including 112 starting assignments, the speedy outfielder ranked among the team leaders in numerous offensive categories in 2006, 2007 and 2008.

Williams, who set a school record with a 27-game hitting streak stretching across the last 14 games of 2007 and the first 13 of 2008, has a career batting average of .342. A second-team All-NCAC honoree in 2006 and 2008 to go along with his first-team All-NCAC award in football in 2007, Williams has 31 doubles, six triples, six home runs, 85 RBI and 33 stolen bases in his baseball career.

• **ON TARGET:** Aaron Huffman hasn't thrown a pass yet in 2008, but through his first two seasons in the Red & White he is on track to break most of Wittenberg's career passing records.

In 21 collegiate games, all starting assignments, Huffman has thrown for 3,349 yards, good for sixth place on Wittenberg's career list. Barring injury and considering his current rate of completions, attempts and yardage, Huffman will almost certainly top records in all three categories. National College Football Hall of Famer Charlie Green, who did not lose a game as a starter between 1961-64, currently is the standard bearer among Wittenberg quarterbacks, having thrown for 5,575 yards.

• **SCOUTING THE TIGER DEFENSE:** After ranking first in the NCAC in scoring and team defense in 2007, the Tigers return nine starters, including three all-conference honorees.

Talent and experience is spread around on the Tiger defense, but nowhere is the depth better than along the line. Senior tackle **Lance Phillips**, senior tackle **Anthony Davis** and junior end **Anthony Oliver** have all earned All-NCAC honors in their collegiate careers, although none are expected to start against Olivet. Phillips and Oliver have been sidelined by injury during summer camp, although Phillips is expected to see the field in the opener. Davis will split time for a second straight year with junior tackle **Taylor Scherer**. He is listed as a starter in the first two-deep of the 2008 season, joined by senior end **Matt Maidlow**, sophomore end **Eddie Vallery** and sophomore tackle **Adam Kattoua**.

Sophomore linebacker Brad McKinley led all freshman in NCAA Division III with 120 tackles a year ago en route to NCAC Newcomer of the Year honors. He will be joined in the starting lineup by sophomore **Ben Maxwell** and junior **Kyle Lohrman**.

Rounding things out, the Tiger secondary is also very experienced, starting on the corners where junior **Brandyn Brown** and senior **Travis Brunic** roam. Brown, an all-conference selection in 2007, has ranked among the team leaders in passes defended and interceptions while also serving as

TUNE IN TO THE TIGERS!

All Wittenberg athletic broadcasts can be heard locally on WUSO 89.1-FM, the university's student-operated station. They also can be heard around the world on the Internet thanks to Wittenberg's partnership with Stretch Internet. Wittenberg fans do not have to pay to listen to broadcasts, and anyone with a computer and an Internet connection can log in and listen.

Wittenberg is blessed with outstanding radio coverage again in 2008 as Scott Leo, who spends his summers as the play-by-play voice of the Columbus Clippers, heads things up. Leo, who has been involved with Wittenberg athletic broadcasts since 2000, will be joined by Assistant Sports Information Director Ben Bradley and Wittenberg sophomore Zach Spring on the majority of this fall's football broadcasts.

The student broadcast team is bigger and better than ever in 2008-09, led by WUSO Sports Director Rob Lehner. The Wittenberg student broadcasters are involved in all aspects of the broadcasts, including sideline reporting, statistical analysis, on-air color analysis, in-game score updates and production work. This year, the team has ambitious plans to produce more than 100 athletics broadcasts in as many as 11 sports, including football, volleyball, men's soccer, women's soccer, field hockey, men's basketball, women's basketball, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, baseball and softball.

• **COACHES SHOW:** Tiger Talk is back again in 2008. It can be heard locally on WUSO 89.1-FM and on the Internet from 7-8 p.m. every Thursday. Leo, Bradley and Spring will host the show, which features interviews with players and coaches and analysis of the Tigers' season to date.

a dangerous punt returner the last two years. The safeties are sophomore **Manny Rodriguez**, one of the team's leading tacklers a year ago, and junior **Keenan Freeman**, who returns from an injury that kept him out all of 2007.

• **SCOUTING THE COMETS:** Olivet has 37 letterwinners, including 10 starters, back from a 2007 team that advanced to the NCAA Division III Tournament for the first time in school history.

Offensively, the Comets return four starters, including running backs Pat Clasgens and Sean Misko, who combined for more than 1,100 yards and nine touchdowns a year ago. Two starters are back on the offensive line to clear the way, while the quarterback and wide receiver positions will feature new starters in 2008.

Olivet ranked first in the MIAA (league games only) in scoring defense and rushing defense and second in total defense a year ago. Linebackers Hakeem Yakubu, a 2007 first-team All-MIAA selection, and Justin Hughes and defensive backs Alex Hill and Michael Terranova, a third-team All-American, are returning starters.

Kicker Kyle Zabel and punter Ryan Patten round out the Comets' returning starters. Patten ranked second in NCAA Division III last year at 43.0 yards per punt.

• **LAST MEETING:** The first of five 2007 road trips outside the state of Ohio was a success for Wittenberg as the Tigers rallied for an improbable 17-16 win at Olivet.

Wittenberg generated 156 yards rushing compared to Olivet's -11. The difference was that the Comets lost two of their six fumbles, while the Tigers recovered all five of their miscues.

Tailback Derrick Braziel led all rushers with 71 yards, while Corey Weber made the most of his first collegiate playing time with 50 yards and a touchdown on 14 carries. Aaron Huffman was 16-of-26 for 169 yards, with his favorite target again being Patrick Williams, who finished with four receptions for 79 yards. Linebackers Brad McKinley and Joe Swanson led Wittenberg with eight tackles each.

• **THE COACHES:** Wittenberg is led by Joe Fincham, a 1988 graduate of Ohio University. In his 12th season at the helm, Fincham has a 108-25 overall record, including a mark of 74-11 in the NCAC and a regular season record of 101-19. His teams have claimed six conference titles, including four straight outright with undefeated records from 1998-2001. Fincham has been named NCAC Coach of the Year five times, including 2006 after he led the Tigers to a conference title, and earned American Football Coaches Association/Kodak District IV Coach of the Year honors in 1998.

Fincham stands second in school history with 104 wins, trailing only National College Football Hall of Famer Dave Maurer, who posted a 129-23-3 record between 1969-83. Fincham is third in winning percentage as his .806 mark trails Maurer (.842) and fellow National College Football Hall of Famer Bill Edwards, who had a 98-20-4 record between 1955-69.

Dominic Livedoti, a 1965 graduate of Olivet and a 2006 inductee into the school's hall of fame, is in the fourth season of his second stint as head coach at Olivet. He has led the Comets to an 17-14 record in the last three years and holds an overall record of 38-35-3 in eight years as the head coach. Livedoti previously served as head coach from 1988-92.

• **DAVE MAURER DAY:** In recognition of his impact on thousands of lives in nearly 40 years as a coach, administrator and professor at Wittenberg, the Wittenberg Committee to Honor Dave Maurer has formed to celebrate Dave Maurer Day on Saturday, Nov. 1. The event coincides with Wittenberg's

final regular season home game against NCAC rival Denison, which kicks off at 1 p.m. that day at Edwards-Maurer Field.

Maurer will be informally honored at halftime of the football game. A reunion dinner for Maurer, his family, friends, former players, fans and supporters will follow in Pam Evans Smith Arena in the HPER Center, starting with a social hour at 5 p.m.

Maurer, a 1987 Wittenberg Athletics Hall of Honor inductee, coached track and field, swimming and diving, and golf at various points during his Wittenberg career, in addition to his well-known exploits on the football sidelines. He also served as the university's director of men's athletics and was a professor of health and physical education.

After more than a decade as an assistant football coach at Wittenberg, Maurer took the reins in 1969. He posted a career record of 129-23-3, good for an .842 winning percentage, and directed three teams to national championships. The Tigers went undefeated three times and won seven Ohio Athletic Conference championships in his 15 seasons as head coach.
